EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION PROVIDES VARIED FUNDING IN 2008-2009

Awarding nearly **\$1.8 million** since 1964, the Educational Foundation Board of Trustees continues its efforts to improve, enrich and encourage intercultural understanding and excellence in education.

More than **\$78,498** renewed 50 projects ranging from groups distributing books to babies, special needs students, ELL learners, libraries and other countries to childcare scholarships for Latino families and a therapy dog in the reading classroom.

More than **\$56,395** funded 33 new projects supporting learners in Canada, Mexico and other countries.

Help includes purchasing educational materials from binoculars and graphing calculators to maps and globes.

- Grants are awarded to employed educators, both Delta Kappa Gamma members and non members.
- Grants are available for all educators, especially for early-career educators and second-career educators.
- In February 2009, \$19,195 in grants went to 17 recipients.
